


Rural Health Networks

Rural Health Networks seek systemic change in health through aligning community services, human resources, and financial assets. They operate as independent organizations that have a formal structure with shared decision-making and accountability among members.



Evolution of Rural Health Networks







Stewardship

Stewardship means taking responsibility for forming working relationships to transform health and well-being across a region. It is an ongoing practice of encouraging alignment, inclusiveness, resident leadership, and knowledge sharing — which is marked by a commitment to the regional effort beyond one's own vested interest.*

Value of Rural Heath Networks Today

- Facilitate breaking down silos
- Crucial for integration of services
- Necessary for addressing Social Determinants of Health
- Change perspectives from organizational focus to community focus



Range of Structures

Collaborative Partnership

A loosely formed coalition of individuals or organizations focused on a singular short-term initiative

Rural Health Network

Independent organization with a formal structure and long-term commitment to solve complex problems





Why Do It?

- Establish trust and long-term relationships
- Create a shared approach to avoid unnecessary duplication of efforts and resources
- Be positioned to take advantage of new opportunities
- Become the stewards of health and wellness for your community into the future





Strategic Planning Process of Network Planning Grant

The Big Picture

- Stage timing of deliverables to support the Strategic Planning Process
- Build toward the Strategic Plan while supporting both infrastructure and programmatic development, and sustainability planning
- Design tools that have value beyond the grant cycle
- Avoid busy work and duplication of efforts



Strategic Planning as a Process

- Completed over several months; not a one-time event
- Includes partners in a meaningful way to elicit perspectives, aspirations, and commitments
- Requires collection and reflection of both quantitative and qualitative data
- Considers policies and trends
- Is on-going and adaptive



Components of a Strategic Planning Process

- Align partners to address a common challenge (MOUs, by-laws, policies/procedures)
- Agree on the purpose (vision, mission...)
- Understand the context (SWOT analysis tools)
 - External Environmental Scan
 - Network Organizational Assessment Road Map
- Develop focus areas and strategies (goals/objectives, sustainability)





Relationship of Deliverables to the Strategic Plan

Network Statement


- Included in the Strategic Plan
- Concise and compelling story of your Network

External Environmental Scan

- Summary included in the Strategic Plan
- Programmatic goals and objectives based on data from the Scan

Network Organizational Assessment Road Map

- Summary included in the Strategic Plan
- Adaptive goals and objectives based on data from the Assessment



Value Beyond the Grant Cycle

- Network Statement is an on-going communications tool
- External Environmental Scan is a process for continuously understanding external factors that impact your Network
- Network Organizational Assessment Road Map is available for you to repeat annually to track progress
- Goals & Objectives are developed/used by Board for accountability



Today's Take Aways

Rural Health Networks

- Operate as independent organizations
- Based on long-term commitments to address intractable issues

Strategic Planning is a Process – not an event

- Requires partner participation
- Is on-going and adaptive
