What is a Rural Health Network?

A Rural Health Network is an independent organization with signed agreements, defined policies, and often by-laws based on a long-term vision for achieving systemic change. Decision-making is shared and distributed among members, and the programmatic focus adapts to changing priorities.

How is a NOA Road Map Helpful?

- Identifies areas of strengths and weaknesses of your Network
- Reveals your Network's capacity to address adaptive challenges with a point-intime assessment
- Determines your desired formality for your Rural Health Network through partner conversations
- Identifies and prioritizes strategies as part of a broader strategic planning process to better position your Network for sustainability and maximum community impact
- Develops the practices that reinforce <u>The Sustainable</u> Network Model

STEP 1a: Individual NOA Road Map

Identify

Identify at least 3 Network partners and at least 1 Network staff person (as appropriate) to individually complete their Individual NOA Road Maps utilizing the provided file. Aim to complete at least 4 total Individual NOA Road Maps.

Provide

Once you have identified your Network participants to complete the **Individual NOA Road Maps**, provide each partner with the **Individual NOA Road Map** document. A sample email explaining your invitation to complete the **Individual NOA Road Map** is below.

Collect and Review

Collect and review each of the **Individual NOA Road Maps** completed by your Network partners and staff, as outlined in Step 1a.

Open

Open the **Composite NOA Road Map** and have all the completed responses from each completed **Individual NOA Road Map** available for reference.

Mark 9

In the Composite NOA Road Map, you'll see blue markers that you may move anywhere along the road image. Mark all the responses you received into this Composite NOA Road Map. You are finished when all your Individual NOA Road Map responses are marked. Delete the unused blue markers from the Road Map. The Composite NOA Road Map allows you to see all the individual responses for each of the 10 Differentiators That Matter in one collective snapshot.

Share

Step 1 is almost complete! The last action item for Step 1 is to share the **Composite NOA Road Map** with your Network partners via email in advance of your meeting to discuss the **Composite NOA Road Map**. See sample email below about sharing your **Composite NOA Road Map** with Network partners. You'll find instructions for facilitating the discussion during the meeting in Step 2, next page.



STEP 2: Final NOA Road Map

Convene

Set a date to meet with your Network partners to discuss the implications of the **Composite NOA Road Map**. Plan for the discussion to last 90 minutes to 2 hours. Your TA Coach is available to help you facilitate this partner meeting, if desired.

Review

During the meeting, review the **10 Differentiators That Matter**, with the partners attending the meeting to focus everyone on those variables.

Present

Present the **Composite NOA Road Map**. Ask the people who completed the **Individual NOA Road Map** to share their reasoning for their marker placements along the road map.

Solicit

Once you've reviewed the variables, solicit reactions to the **Composite NOA Road Map**. Ask the Network partners to offer their interpretations and thoughts about the placements for the **10 Differentiators That Matter**. During your discussion, ask the partners these questions:

- Where do we agree? Where do we disagree?
- What is our consensus?
- What is our BIG picture?
- What are the headlines that may describe our current level of network formality?

Open the **NOA Road Map Report** document. Indicate the consensus of the current placements of all the **10 Differentiators That Matter** into the Final **NOA Road Map** by using the **blue marker** in that document.

STEP 2

STEP 2: Final NOA Road Map, continued

Engage

Start a discussion with the partners about the appropriateness of your Network's current placements, using the following questions:

- What are the dynamics that have contributed to our current position for each of the **10 Differentiators That Matter**?
- What has worked well? What has been challenging?
- Are we comfortable with where we are right now? What are our strengths?
 Where might we be falling behind?

Determine

Determine the desired formality for your Network along the road between a Collaborative Partnership and a formal Rural Health Network by discussing the following questions for each differentiator:

- Is this the optimum placement for our Network as we move beyond the Planning grant cycle?
- If not, how far down the road do we want to be in becoming a more formal Rural Health Network?

Research

Reach consensus on the aspirational formality of your Network for each of the **10** Differentiators That Matter.

Indicate



Indicate your aspirational placements for all **10 Differentiators That Matter** on your **Final NOA Road Map** using the **green marker** with the letter A for aspirational.

Identify

Discuss

Discuss the necessary next steps for moving toward the desired formality of your Network for each of the Differentiators selected.

Enter

Enter next steps for your prioritized Differentiators into the **Next Steps for Moving Our Network Forward** provided in the **NOA Road Map Final Report** document. (Note: It is not necessary to indicate next steps for all **10 Differentiators That Matter**).

Write

Submit

Submit your completed **NOA Road Map Final Report** (which includes the **Final NOA Road Map**, from Step 2, the **Next Steps** table from Step 3, and the **NOA Road Map Summary** from Step 4). The completed **NOA Road Map Final Report** is the required FORHP Network Organizational Assessment deliverable which must be uploaded into the Electronic Hand Book (EHB). Also email a copy of the report to your TA Coach and Project Officer.
